










KANE KEID: SOUTH AFRICA'S FAST RISING RAP SENSATION.

Escape Mag: "Flex (On My Ex)" was a breakout single for you, showcasing a versatile sound that resonated with audiences.


Yande: Yande keeps evolving. The proof is in the music.

I realized I needed to learn animation, so I gained basic knowledge from YouTube. Now, it's all by God's grace.


Escape Mag: Your portfolio reflects a diverse range of skills, from music covers to character designs. How do you balance your artistic interests and disciplines?






Jexways: Music covers and character designs are fundamental aspects of my art, making it easy for me to navigate through them. The only unrelated skill I possess is architecture, which has been challenging to balance. Essentially, I focus on the sketching aspect of architecture, eliminating the need to be physically present with architects to convey architectural concepts. Currently, I work from home, creating 3D architectural models and sketches as primary outputs. This setup will continue until I pursue my master's degree. Managing the balance between my skills comes naturally to me, showcasing my talent for multitasking.


Escape Mag: What drives your creative process when working on projects like 2D animations or visual loops? HUMAN TERROR. DIGITAL ART BY JEXWAYS



Jexways: My creative process in animation projects is primarily driven by the song itself. Upon listening, I envision what the song looks like and then begin the representation. It can be challenging to find inspiration for songs that are not very interesting, but I strive to make the animation exceptional to elevate the song (in my opinion). Glorious songs or projects are a major inspiration for me, along with observing fellow artists working on something that catches my interest - I tend to take inspiration from them, like an artist. Additionally, Pinterest serves as another source of inspiration for me. Escape Mag: You mentioned exploring 3D animation. How do you approach learning new techniques and tools in this rapidly evolving field?

Jexways: Learning 3D animation will be easy for me. I have been procrastinating due to the numerous deliverables on my plate. The interface is akin to the 3D software I used during my time in architecture school, making it easier to grasp. However, mastering 3D will still require some time and effort. I look forward to learning it at my own pace, without feeling pressured to excel immediately.







Escape Mag: Your NFT collection, "Adventures of Dante," has gained attention in the digital art community. Could you share the story behind its creation and your experience in the NFT market?

Jexways: The story behind the adventures of Dante has always been impressive. Initially, I had no idea what to present to the people in the NFTs market. However, I soon realized that many individuals have diverse interests in the entertainment world, such as anime lovers, cartoon enthusiasts, and more. This led me to transform Dante into various beloved characters like One Punch Man and Naruto. Through this, Dante found his true essence. I even got to sell one of my NFTs to X back when they were Twitter.

Escape Mag: How do you see the role of digital artists evolving in today's creative landscape, especially with the rise of digital platforms and metaverses?

Jexways: The digital art market will expand beyond its current achievements. AI and NFTs have already influenced this market, but artistic styles will continue to vary based on individual and AI creators. The evolution has begun, potentially accelerating art production. Rather than diminishing digital art in the market, AI will likely enhance it. I am actively involved in creating digital art for valued users, establishing a platform for sharing art and music streams across all platforms. The metaverse is experiencing remarkable growth!

Escape Mag: Your involvement in guiding the new age revolution of graphic designers is commendable. Can you elaborate on the importance of mentorship and community building in the digital art realm? Jexways: The significance of mentorship is crucial to support young artists during challenging phases, such as when commissions are irregular. Mentorship plays a key role in guiding artists on how to navigate these situations. Another vital aspect of mentorship is managing artist-client interactions, as clients can range from composed to demanding. Responding inappropriately to an extreme client could jeopardize an artist's reputation or safety. This is where the art community steps in-within this community, not all members are erratic; some offer valuable insights that can enhance how artists engage with clients, provided the artists are willing to share their concerns. Additionally, being part of a community is essential as it constantly showcases new art, motivating others to initiate their own projects and avoid stagnation. A community serves as a catalyst for growth, pushing artists out of their comfort zones and fostering continuous improvement. However, I believe that mentorship is most effective when led by experienced artists and a supportive team.

Colours of the Continent

Escape Mag: As an architect specialising in landscaping, how does your architectural background influence your approach to digital art and animation?

Jexways: Architecture supports my artistic endeavours in various ways. Not only does it enhance the visual aspect of art, but the discipline instilled in me during my architectural studies has pushed me to work late into the night to meet tight deadlines. Additionally, architecture aids me in devising efficient solutions for client projects, allowing me to work more effectively and deliver promptly. While landscaping has not directly influenced my art due to its focus on terrain planning, architecture has significantly informed my artistic background. Constructing buildings comes more naturally to me as I tend to think on a grand scale when bringing a concept to life. In conclusion, I would attribute 100% of the improvement in my art to the influence of architecture.



Escape Mag: What advice would you give to aspiring digital artists and animators who are just starting their journey in this field?

Jexway: Advice to young artists just starting out, trust your imagination about things 100% because that's essentially what people need to hear or see to brighten up their day.



Escape Mag: Finally, where do you envision your career heading in the next few years, and what legacy do you hope to leave behind as an animator and digital artist?

Jexways: My career is vast, with the vision of DANTE becoming a character in Disney world being just one of many visions. The legacy remains untold for now, but it embodies God's Grace.





THE LEAGUE

Showtime Flag plays a 7-on-7 coed format. Each team must field at least 3 female players on every play. The league plays a modified version of the International Federation of American Football rule system. The league currently has 10 teams and they all compete over three stages of competition.

- The regular season: each team competes in a round robin format. The top 6 teams based on win percentage advance to the playoffs stage.
- The Playoffs: 6 teams compete for a place in the Showtime bowl.
- Showtime Bowl: the championship match is where the winner of the season is determined. Winners of the Bowl will win a custom trophy, championship rings and cash prize.
